Eighth Session of the International Solar Alliance Assembly 27 - 30 October 2025

Venue: Bharat Mandapam, Pragati Maidan, New Delhi, 110001, Republic of India

1. General

The Eighth Session of the ISA Assembly will be held in New Delhi, India, at the Bharat Mandapam, Pragati Maidan from 27 to 30 October 2025. **The Assembly Session is scheduled on 28 October 2025, in person** in New Delhi, India, from 09:00 hours IST.

2. Registration for the Eighth Session of the ISA Assembly

- 2.1. Registration is <u>mandatory</u> for all delegates participating in the Eighth Session of the ISA Assembly. Delegates are requested to register online by filling out the form made available through the following link: https://registration.isaassembly.org/
- 2.2. All Delegates are requested to register no later than **14 October 2025.** Online registration is mandatory to facilitate protocol, logistics, end-to-end security, health measures and seating during the Assembly Session.
- 2.3. To ensure a seamless registration process, the delegates must submit the completed form, including the duly filled-in Credential Form or the Accreditation Form, by **14 October 2025** unless extended. (The forms can be downloaded from the registration link provided.)
- 2.4. Delegate badges will be issued from **17 October 2025** between 09:00 hours to 18:00 hours IST at the ISA registration desk at the Ashok Hotel Lobby.
- 2.5. The delegates may depute their representatives from their country's Embassy/ High Commission/Consulate in New Delhi to collect the badges and delegate kit from 09:00 hours IST on 17 October 2025 onwards.

3. Logistical support to the ISA Member and Signatory Countries

- 3.1. While the ISA Member and Signatory Countries are expected to bear costs for their delegates, limited support is made available for the Hon'ble Minister plus one accompanying National Focal Point or a Designated Official from the ISA Member and Signatory countries that are Least Developing Countries (LDCs) and Small Island Developing States (SIDS). This support will include round-trip airfares from the respective country's capital city to New Delhi, accommodation in New Delhi, all meals, and local transportation.
- 3.2. The ISA Secretariat will also extend the support mentioned above to the Hon'ble Minister (only) handling the energy or environment portfolio from the Prospective Countries that are LDCs and SIDS.
- 3.3. Additional delegates nominated by the aforesaid ISA Member and Signatory Countries are welcome to participate at their own cost, subject to the registration and approval process.
- 3.4. All delegates are requested to arrange the visas for their delegations for entry into India. The confirmation letter from the ISA Secretariat upon registration confirmation may be used for the visa application process.
- 3.5. Free wireless internet access would be available in select meeting halls and the public areas of the Assembly venue.

4. Entry and seating in the Assembly Hall

- 4.1. The Countries will be seated in alphabetical order in the Assembly Hall.
- 4.2. Five delegates per Country and three delegates per Partner Organisation and other categories may be seated in the designated seats in the Assembly Hall. Priority shall be accorded to the Hon'ble Minister, the National Focal Point/Senior Government official and the head of diplomatic mission in New Delhi (Ambassadors, High Commissioners and Honorary Consulates).
- 4.3. Other delegates may be seated in the additional seats in the Assembly Hall.
- 4.4. Delegates will be guided to their respective seats at the Assembly Hall by the ushers.

2. General guidelines:

- 2.1. **Credentials form:** to be submitted by the Member Countries of the ISA who have signed and ratified the ISA Framework Agreement and have deposited the instrument of Ratification with the Depository.
- 2.2. **Accreditation Form:** to be submitted by
 - a. Signatory Countries who have signed the Framework Agreement of the ISA under Article VII but are yet to ratify it;
 - b. Prospective Member Countries who have not yet signed the Framework Agreement of the ISA.
- 2.3. The completed Credentials or Accreditation forms can be uploaded online when submitting the registration or emailed to assembly@isa.int by 14 October 2025. However, the delegates are requested to submit duly completed forms at the earliest to enable seamless registration and necessary arrangements for the Eighth Session of the ISA Assembly.
- 2.4. After **14 October 2025**, changes, if necessary, to existing registrations will only be possible through the **'Special Cases Cell'** (shir.seth@isa.int) at the ISA Secretariat. Delegations are urged to ensure that such requests are limited to the absolute minimum. This facility can only be accessed for unavoidable last-minute changes in the delegation composition.



- 2.5. Delegates must submit the completed registration form, including a scanned photo and passport, wherever applicable. Forms submitted with missing information, such as unclear passport copies or picture discrepancies, among others, will not be processed. Based on the successful registration and approval, a confirmation email will be sent to all the delegates, which may be used for visa application.
- 2.6. Credentials or Accreditation forms are **NOT** required for Organisations.
- 2.7. For identification and security reasons, all delegates are requested always to wear their badges at the venue. The loss of a meeting badge should be communicated to the ISA Secretariat at the earliest at assembly@isa.int.

ANNEXURE III

Details of the travel advisory, visa, accommodation, local transport, and safety and security

1. Travel Advisory

1.1. Visa

- 1.1.1. All visitors to India are required to possess a valid passport with validity of at least 6 (six) months from the date of entry into Indian territory. For delegates from countries with visa requirements, obtaining a valid visa (Conference Visa) before arrival is recommended. It is advisable to submit visa applications at the earliest to the relevant Indian Embassy / Consulate.

- 1.1.2. The duly filled application must be submitted to the Indian Diplomatic Mission in the delegates' country, with two recent passport-size-coloured photographs, a copy of the itinerary or flight ticket, and the confirmation letter from the ISA Secretariat received upon confirmation of registration. It may be noted that a conference visa cannot be applied 'online' as an e-visa. For visa-related inquiries, please visit the website of the respective Indian Embassy/Consulate.
- 1.1.3. Delegates from countries that do not have an Indian Mission in their country or a Diplomatic Mission in India may contact protocol@isa.int.

1.2. Flight Tickets

1.2.1. For delegates from ISA Member and Signatory Countries that are LDCs and SIDS:

- a. The ISA Secretariat will provide round trip flight tickets (to New Delhi from the capital city of the respective countries) for a 2-member delegation from each country.
- b. The class of tickets will be provided as follows business class to the Hon'ble Ministers or Vice-Ministers and economy class to the National Focal Points / designated official. In case the Hon'ble Minister or Vice Minister is unable to attend, two officials will be provided with economy class tickets. Additional delegates are welcome to participate at their own cost.



1.2.2. For delegates from ISA Prospective Member Countries that are LDCs and SIDS:

a. The ISA Secretariat will provide round-trip flight tickets in business class (to New Delhi from the capital city of the respective countries) only for the Hon'ble Minister.

1.2.3. For delegates from ISA Member, Signatory and Prospective Member Countries that are NOT LDCs and SIDS:

a. The delegates are requested to arrange the flight tickets on their own.

1.3. Accommodation and catering

1.3.1. For delegates from ISA Member and Signatory Countries that are LDCs and SIDS:

- a. The ISA Secretariat will provide accommodation at the Ashok Hotel for a 2-member delegation from each country from 27 to 30 October 2025 (4 nights).
- b. The hotel rooms will be provided as follows Suite for the Hon'ble Ministers or Vice-Ministers and Classic or deluxe rooms for the National Focal Points / Designated Official. In case the Hon'ble Minister or Vice Minister is unable to attend, two officials will be provided with classic or deluxe rooms.



- c. All meals and WIFI services during the stay in New Delhi for the two delegates will be included with the Accommodation. However, all other incidental costs, including alcohol, tobacco, IDD calls, in-room minibar services, and pay channels, among others, will be at the expense of the delegates and are to be settled directly with the hotel at the time of checkout
- d. The facility of hotel laundry service will be extended only to the Hon'ble Ministers.
- e. The cost of accommodation and other services prior to or after the applicable dates for hospitality are the responsibility of individual delegates and will be required to be settled by each delegate on checkout from the hotel.
- f. Additional delegates are welcome to participate at their own cost.

1.3.2. For delegates from ISA Prospective Member Countries that are LDCs and SIDS:

a. The ISA Secretariat will provide a suite at the Ashok Hotel only for the Hon'ble Minister from 27 to 30 October 2025 (4 nights). All services are available to the delegates as under Clause 1.3.1. will be available for the Hon'ble Minister.

1.3.3. For delegates from ISA Member, Signatory and Prospective Member Countries that are NOT LDCs and SIDS:

a. The delegates are requested to arrange the accommodation in New Delhi at their own cost.

1.4. Local transport and protocol

1.4.1. For delegates from ISA Member and Signatory Countries that are LDCs and SIDS:

- One courtesy chauffeur-driven sedan car will be provided to the Hon'ble Minister or Vice Minister and one accompanying official.
- b. A designated team deployed at the airport will assist each arriving delegation to their respective cars. The designated car and a Liaison officer will remain with the Ministerial delegation throughout their stay in New Delhi.
- c. Additional transport may be booked directly by delegations at their own cost. All major hotels provide reliable taxi services.
- d. Transport from the Ashok Hotel to Bharat Mandapam and back will be provided for all delegates.

1.4.2. For delegates from ISA Prospective Member Countries that are LDCs and SIDS:



- a. The ISA Secretariat will provide all transport and protocol services only to the Hon'ble Minister as indicated in Clause 1.4.1.
- b. Transport from the Ashok Hotel to Bharat Mandapam and back will be provided for all delegates.

1.4.3. For delegates from ISA Member, Signatory and Prospective Member Countries that are NOT LDCs and SIDS:

- a. All necessary protocol accorded to Hon'ble Ministers shall be provided including a Liaison officer and local transportation on request.
- b. The delegates are requested to arrange local transport on their own.
- c. A designated team deployed at the airport will assist each arriving delegation.
- d. Transport from the Ashok Hotel to Bharat Mandapam and back will be provided for all delegates, on request.

1.5. Safety and Security

- 1.5.1. The Assembly proceedings will be a high-security event with entry with an invitation only. Delegate badges will be screened at all entrances to the venue and the Assembly and Conference halls.
- 1.5.2. All delegates are requested to wear the badges visibly at the venue during the Assembly Session.
- 1.5.3. Please be advised that metal detectors and x-ray equipment will be installed at all entry points to the Assembly venue and that all delegates will be screened each time they enter the area. The security measures may cause some inconvenience. The ISA Secretariat appreciates your patience and wishes to emphasise that the security measures are for the security of all attending delegates.
