Vision Statement of India for Presidency of ISA for 5th and 6th General Assembly

The International Solar Alliance has emerged as one of the most important stakeholders in the global arena in the fight against climate change and for ensuring clean energy transition and energy access. India is committed to further ISA's vision of engaging closely with the comity of nations for leveraging solar energy in solar resource rich countries by facilitating access to low cost finance, technology and innovation.

India aims to build upon the foundational work done in its first 2 tenures to cement ISA's identity as a reliable international partner for furthering member nations' plans of enhancing solar technology adoption across multiple verticals such as utility scale deployment, decentralized applications, rooftop programs as well as new areas of interventions such as green hydrogen and storage. India, as President, will help ISA create conducive scenarios for solar-ready policies and regulatory development of national energy landscapes and for engaging with public and private sector entities to leverage low cost financing to achieve ISA's 'Towards 1000' strategy. The ISA will be developed into an international resource hub with in-house technical expertise that will be readily accessible by member nations and shall be capable of guiding project implementation at scale. It shall work closely with Partner Organizations to discover synergies across the solar value spectrum.

India has provided ISA with substantial resources in terms of financial and manpower assets and will continue to do so in line with our commitments. India has recently announced a commitment of 37.72 million USD for ISA Secretariat and has a significant manpower deployment from its national agencies on secondment. India has recognized ISA's judicial personality by entering into Headquarters Agreement with ISA and provided immunity to ISA personnel at par with UN organizations. India will continue to work with member nations for providing sustainable operational commitments to the ISA in the future.

The ISA has made significant strides in leading the global climate change conversation and has built a strong and functional base since its creation. It is India's vision to launch it to the next level as a reliable, responsive, capable and powerful international organization in the fight against climate change.
